#### General Manager's Update (Danielle van Kampen)

- We had 2 TRI's in the month of September.
- DvK advised that we just hit the 3million hours Loss Time Injury Free
- KRMA
  - The SHOT's are going well with 1004 interactions in September.
  - Incident level is starting to decrease
- Open Pits
  - Ore tonnes are still slightly down

- Gold Oz recovered was well on target for September
- The Pit was slightly down on tonnes.
- Mt Charlotte
  - Mt Charlotte continues to perform well
  - There is a much better grade out of the pit
  - Gold recovered and shipped is showing great results
- YTD we are travelling quite well, grade is good.

#### Environment – (Graeme Smith)

- Dust performance for September – all readings below the NEMP standard.
- Noise Monitoring, we have compliance monitoring between 10pm & 12pm, this is being monitored on a quarterly basis and currently is meeting the standards required.
- Approvals
  - Kaltails project we are still waiting approval from the DEP, expect approval during October, waiting on final sign off.
  - Gidji TSF Extension the EPA still have this under assessment.
    - The mining proposal is being prepared.
  - Closure is proceeding on schedule
- Overall a very good month in Environmental.

- Sales in the shop were \$17,565 with a profit of \$6,832
- Good number of visitors in the shop – 3,327 visitors, an average of 151 per day
- There were 18 tours totaling 658 visitors onsite over September
