## 6. AGENDA ITEMS

## **Environment Reporting (Michelle Berryman)**

- Incidents:
  - Seven dust incidents greater than 50ug/m³ at various sites, all have been investigated.
  - Four spigot samples greater than 50mg/L, all samples have been re-tested.
- Blasting Management:
  - KCGM's Noise and Vibration Management Plan describes how we control, monitor and report all blasting.
  - There are six noise and six vibration monitors along the pit.
  - The blasting dust management plan was developed in 1992 and revised in 2001.
  - Blasts are closely managed to minimise impacts on the community, particularly when they are close to the surface.
  - Dust events above the NEPM Standard are reviewed and potential source contributors identified. The DEC and DoH are notified within 7 days and it is also reported on the annual repost summary.
  - A 24 hour average of daily dust management is available on the KCGM website which all public can access.
- Life of Mine extension
  - KCGM requires various regulatory approvals for the new Life of Mine date.

# Social Responsibility (Jacqui Niemand) Activities in February:

- 513 volunteer hours for Boulder Market Day, clean up Hannans North and Community Open Day.
- 36 Media reports in February, 11 positive, 25 neutral and 0 negative.
- There were 2 sponsorships approved in February totaling \$1,212, these were 2 donations.
- In February KCGM had 56 recorded public interactions, 13 were complaints: SO<sub>2</sub> (8), Blasting (4), and Community Development (1).
- A monthly overview of the past 6 months of visitors and shop proceeds into the Super Pit Shop was shown.
  - 2,822 visitors visited the Super Pit Shop in February.

#### 7. GENERAL BUSINESS

MS asked if KCGM have any views on Portlink. MB advised that KCGM has met with the City of Kalgoorlie-Boulder as part of their land use planning.

AP advised that the Loopline project is still ongoing. MP advised that KCGM are currently developing a project plan and drafting a legal agreement to define timelines and the project scope. KCGM is committed to the earthworks required for the Loopline to reach the Super Pit Lookout.

ML advised that he is working on a HR attraction video which will focus on working at KCGM and living in Kalgoorlie-Boulder.

AP asked if we have an updated on when the Underground mine at Hannans North will reopen. JN advised there is major electrical and plumbing repairs required before it can be re-opened.
