General Manager's Update (Ian Butler)

- Safety:
 - One significant incident and no recordable injuries in May.
 - A good safety performance during the month.
 - Ongoing focus is on critical risks and identifying critical controls.
- Physicals:
 - Open Pits above budget on material moved.
 - Mt Charlotte tones mined are close to budget.
 - Processing tonnes milled is below budget on material moved.
- The Gidji UFG (Ultra Fine Grinding) Mill official opening was held early June.
- Loss Time Injuries (LTI) 1Million man hours injury free has been reached during May.

Waste Dumps (Tim Berryman)

- KCGM Open Pit mines up to 80 million tonnes per annum, until 2019.
- 15% is ore and 85% is waste.
- High Grade Ore is processed through the Fimiston Processing Plant, Low grade ore is stockpiled for later processing and waste is stacked in Waste Rock Dumps.
- KCGM Underground mines up to 1 million tonnes per annum, until 2018.
- Ore is processed at the Fimiston Processing Plant and Waste is used for stope backfilling.
- KCGM currently has three active waste dumping areas.
- Waste Rock Limitations include Airport Height Restrictions and Footprint constraints.
- KCGM is progressively rehabilitating approximately 2,000 hectares including, Waste Dumps, Tailings storage facilities and historically degraded areas.

Social Responsibility (Peta Jurgens)

- Williamstown Asbestos
 - Remediation and emu bobbing has been completed on the KCGM managed blocks.
- Hidden Secret Underground Project residents will be notified before production commences.
- UFG opening event and Barrick Global Awards presentation were held early June. Both events went very well.
- Community Investment Programme update
 - You Can Do It: social and emotional wellbeing programme. \$76,000 over three years (2013 - 2015)
 - Clontarf Foundation: Kalgoorlie Football Academy. \$90,000 over three years (2013 2015)
 - Ray Finlayson Sporting Complex. \$1 million over four years (2014 2017)
